Creative Gift	Indicators
Architect/Builder	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Is energized by starting new projects. • Able to identify the important elements that lay the foundation for new initiatives. • Can effectively predict outcomes of new initiatives and put measures in place to minimize or eliminate the negative effects. • Is patient during the planning process- willing to put time into planning in order to "do it right" from the start.
Communicator	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Able to help people understand complicated, multi-faceted situations and concepts. • Patient with others' learning styles and seeks to communicate in a way that helps others learn. • Willing to listen as well as talk. • Able to see a situation from multiple points of view and communicate those effectively to others.
Artist	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Able to recognize and appreciate beauty in the world around you. • Notices details like color, texture, and light, and is able to use those to communicate a message through their own artwork. • Willing to imagine, speculate, and play without worry of how others will perceive their art or actions. • Interprets ideas and concepts through visual symbols and representations.
Storyteller	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Has a good memory and a vivid imagination. • Isn't limited by what is, what has been, or what can be in reality. • Is able to relate to the individual needs of the audience and help them see themselves as part of the story. • Able to use the power of words to create images in others' minds that help them understand a concept or new idea.
Systems Thinker	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Able to identify brokenness within an organization. • Creates systems and structures that bring order and organization to help groups and organizations function more effectively. • Listens and gathers data before proposing solutions to problems. • Sees systems as tools to help people accomplish their goals, not as rigid rules that inhibit growth.

Problem Solver	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Presses into perceived problems to uncover root causes and assumptions. • Listens and asks questions before seeking a solution. • Is willing to be both a learner and advice giver. • Willing to think through and explore multiple solutions before deciding on a preferred course of action.
Innovator	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Is not limited by the way things are- is able to discern assumption from fact. • Able to discover new uses/ideas from what is already in existence to improve and refine results. • Willing to experiment, fail, and grow. • Is energized by the unknown or uncertainty.
Relationship Builder	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Looks for opportunities to relate and interact with others. • Is a student of others- listening and learning from their words, actions, and body language. • Enjoys being with others socially. • Appreciates the ministry of presence and walking with others through difficult times.
Musician	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Notices depth, movement, and tone in sounds. • Is emotionally moved and is able to move others' emotions through musical expression. • Personally connects with God through musical worship. • Is able to communicate feelings, moods, and concepts through musical expression.
Healer	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Sees the benefit and purpose of leading a holistically healthy lifestyle. • Is able to diagnose and identify when individuals are physically or emotionally unhealthy. • Genuinely cares about helping others improve their quality of life. • Has the knowledge to use techniques, medicine, and strategies to guide people to wellness.
Teacher	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Desires to help communicate truth to others. • Provides environments where others learn through discovery and experience. • Is able to relate abstract concepts to everyday life so people can learn how to apply what they've learned. • Is willing to let students learn at their own pace, in their own way and teach from a point of influence instead of the voice of authority.
Provider	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Accurately identifies others' needs. • Willing to put own needs aside to provide for the needs of others. • Finds great joy in giving. • Looks for ways to serve instead of seeking to be served.
Reconciler	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Feels deep empathy for those in conflict. • Is able to see both sides of an issue and help opposing parties embrace another point of view. • Helps people find common ground. • Brings a sense of calm and peace in the midst of difficult circumstances.

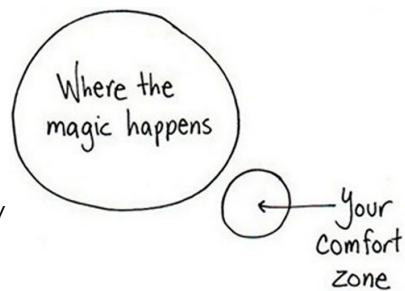
Motivator	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Easily influences many people. • Communicates in a winsome and encouraging way. • Is able to inspire people to do things they've never done so they can grow and improve. • Acknowledges and finds the good in others and helps others see the value in themselves.
Organizer	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Is able to bring order from chaos. • Enjoys finishing a project. • Prioritizes efficiency. • Can effectively sort through issues, problems, or ideas to discover what they have in common.
