“What Really Matters”

WESLEY COVENANT RENEWAL SERVICE

Brothers and sisters in Christ, the Christian life is redeemed from sin and consecrated to God. Through baptism, we have entered this life and have been admitted into the new covenant of which Jesus Christ is the Mediator. He sealed it with his own blood, that it might last forever. On the one side, God promises to give us new life in Christ, the source and perfecter of our faith. On the other side, we are pledged to live no more for ourselves but only for Jesus Christ, who loved us and gave himself for us.

From time to time we renew our covenant with God, especially when we reaffirm the Baptismal Covenant and gather at the Lord's table. Today, however, we meet, as the generations before us have met, to renew the covenant that binds us to God. Let us make this covenant of God our own.

INVITATION

(responsive)

Commit yourselves to Christ as his partners and co-heirs. Give yourselves to him, that you may belong to him. Christ has many services to be done. Some are more easy and honorable, others are more difficult and disgraceful. Some are suitable to our inclinations and interests, others are contrary to both. In some we may please Christ and please ourselves. But then there are other works where we cannot please Christ except by denying ourselves. It is necessary, therefore, that we consider what it means to be a servant of Christ. Let us, therefore, go to Christ, and pray:

Let me be your servant, under your command.

I will no longer be my own.

I will give up myself to your will in all things.

Be satisfied that Christ shall give you your place and work. Christ will be the Savior of all who work for love. He is the source of all salvation. Christ will be all in all, or he will be nothing. Today, we will confirm these words by holy covenant.

COVENANT PRAYER

(responsive)

O righteous God, for the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, see us as we come before you. Forgive our unfaithfulness in not having done your will, for you have promised mercy to us if we turn to you with our whole heart.

God requires that you shall put away all your idols.

We are here to renounce them all, covenanting with you that no known sin shall be allowed in our lives. Against your will, we have turned our love toward the world. In your power we will watch all temptations that will lead us away from you. For our own righteousness is riddled with sin, unable to stand before you.

Through Christ, God has offered to be your God again if you would let him.

Before all heaven and earth, we here acknowledge you as our God. We take you, Creator, Redeemer, and Sustainer, and vow to give up ourselves to serve you in holiness and righteousness all the days of our lives.

God has given the Lord Jesus Christ as the only way and means of coming to God.

We accept Christ and join ourselves in a covenant with him. Blessed Christ we know we are not worthy and you choose us anyway. We know we are not wise, and you should be our only guide. We know our will is imperfect, and we seek your will always.

Christ has told you that you must suffer with him.

We are in awe of your mercy and covenant to take our lot with you. Through your grace we promise that neither life nor death shall part us from you.

God has given holy laws as the rule of your life.

We do take your words as law, and your law as good and holy. We willingly take up yoke with you, so that our words, thoughts and actions may be motivated by citizenship in your kingdom. We will strive not to neglect those things you ask of us, and we will admit when we have faltered.

The almighty God searches and knows your heart.

God, we make this covenant without meaning any trickery or falsehood. If we have deceived ourselves, help us set our hearts toward what is good, what is just, what is holy. We do all things for the glory of God, whom we desire to look upon. Glory to God the Creator, Glory to God the Redeemer, Glory to God the Sustainer, by your grace, life, death, resurrection and inspiration you have turned my life from sin to redemption. So be it. Let the covenant I have made on earth be ratified in heaven. Amen.

Brothers and sisters, you have made a covenant today, here, before God and before your village. Take strength in the promises you have made to God, knowing well that you are able to make promises

because God first promised you goodness and mercy. Take strength knowing that you are able to keep these promises in love because God first loved you. Keep this covenant not only in your heart, but in word; not only in word, but in writing; not only in writing, but in deed.

Keep it as a reminder between God and yourselves that you may remember in the days of doubt and temptation, that you have the holy power to resist evil, that you have been given gifts of grace and forgiveness, that you have audience with the God of the cosmos who comes to you when you call his name.

The God who has revealed himself to the world as a baby, as an adolescent, as a man and God is made vibrant through the work of his servants. Do good work, love God, and remember the many ways Christ has been at work, in doing this and in trusting the power of the Holy Spirit, 2017 is sure to be a kingdom year.
