## **Grant Resource Guide**

- **Grants.gov** Houses available federal grants and gives you the ability to apply for them while giving background information on grant eligibility.
- WVPass.org -The West Virginia Partnerships to Assure Student Success provides a list of grants available in West Virginia focusing on community, education, healthy start, literacy, mentoring, and non-profit.
- **SAMHSA.gov** The Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration has a list of all grants available through SAMHSA to address substance abuse.
- GrantSpace.org Provides tools and resources to help you become an improved grant applicant.
- **GrantWatch.org** Posts grants available from government agencies, foundations, and corporations which give subscribers a general view of the types of grants which are available in their field of interest.
- FoundationCenter.org Helps you find local foundations and available funding while helping to improve your skills in grant writing.
- Cof.org/community-foundation-locator Provides a list of community foundations in West Virginia.

## Helpful Tips

- Follow all rules and procedures
- Write briefly, concisely, and clearly
- Learn all that you can about the grantor
- Use key words from the proposal request
- Contact the grantor with any questions
- Seek outside criticism to review proposal
- Follow all deadlines

## Grant Process

- Request for proposal
- Write grant proposal within deadline
  - cover letter, executive summary, body, resources and capabilities, & budget
- Grant Decision
- Thank you letter regardless of whether you receive the grant
- Follow up with progress if grant is recieved
