1) bring any kit "ingredients" (listed below) to Jackson's Mill Sept. 9-10 and drop them off at the check-in on the porch of the Marion Cabin next to the Assembly Hall and/or

2) help assemble kits any time from 1 to 4 p.m. on Saturday, Sept. 10, in the Assembly Hall.

Here are the kit ingredients: Dish detergent - 14-oz. to 20-oz. size; All-purpose spray cleaner (without bleach) , 32-oz. size; Dish cloth or cleaning rag; Roll paper towels; Kitchen garbage bags, 13-gal. size.
