

SEMINARY COURSE REQUIREMENTS FOR FULL MEMBERSHIP

¶324.4, 2016 Book of Discipline

Every candidate pursuing ordination as elder or deacon must review the sub-paragraphs of ¶324 of the 2016 Book of Discipline. For a candidate to be qualified for ordination (either deacon or elder) in the United Methodist Church, he or she must have taken courses covering the following basic graduate theological studies:

	Old Testament
	New Testament
	Theology
	Church History
	Mission of the Church in the World
	Evangelism
	Worship/Liturgy
	United Methodist Doctrine*
	United Methodist Polity*
	United Methodist History*
	*The United Methodist courses are sometimes offered in combination for less than 3 credits.
<u>For candidates on the elder track</u> : The West Virginia Conference requires that candidates on the elder track must also complete the following courses prior to ordination:	
	Church administration (may be titled differently, but should include themes of leadership styles and organizational systems)
	Pastoral care
	Preaching

In keeping with the University Senate guidelines, West Virginia Conference students may engage in fully online courses <u>only</u> at one of the 13 United Methodist seminaries (or Asbury Seminary). Students attending a non-United Methodist seminary accredited by the University Senate may participate in courses by distance learning format that includes at least 50% face-to-face interaction.
